

It was also difficult to find a childcare option that was under the \$800 that is estimated for the average person living in the lower mainland. Other parts of the project, such as the grocery shopping and house-hunting was enjoyable, and it was interesting to look into such areas,
- d) Yes, I was able to purchase all services and merchandise that I needed.
- e) I was able to purchase most of the services and merchandise that I wanted, keeping in mind that I wanted to have as much money for my savings account as possible.
- f) I chose to go without buying a television and paying for a monthly cable bill. I also chose to spend less money on clothing, as well as look at the furniture postings on Craigslist to find affordable furniture. I also chose a two bedroom townhome, so I could have a roommate and share the rent, as well as the costs of the furniture that would be utilized by the both us, with them.
